

Public Health

"Public health is what we, as a society, do collectively to assure the conditions in which people can be healthy."

- Institute of Medicine, The future of public health. 1988
- The WE has never been more important
 - Scarcity of resources
 - Assurance of essential public health services
 - Assessment involves the entire community

The WE of Public Health





a systematic examination of the health status indicators for a given population that is used to identify key problems in a community



- Assess and prioritize the health needs
- Assess and prioritize our capacity to meet those health needs
- Develop an action plan
 - Health improvement plan
 - Capacity improvement plan
- Implement Evaluation
- Assessment is an ongoing process


- Mobilizing community engagement
- Action implementation of a Health Improvement Plan
- Planning built on strategic planning concepts
- Partnerships the public's health is a concern of the community



- National Association of County and City Health Officials (NACCHO) and Public Health Practice Program Office of CDC
- 2nd generation planning tool (APEX*PH*)
 - evidence-based; published research
 - Many demonstration sites and model practices
- Increasing use as public health moves towards voluntary accreditation

- Community-driven strategic planning model for improving community health
- Develop a shared vision of a healthy community
- Apply strategic thinking to prioritize public health issues and identify resources to address them
- Cyclical planning model



Community Themes & Strengths

- Answers questions:
 - What is important to our community?
 - How is quality of life perceived in our community?
 - What assets do we have that can be used to improve community health?
- Provides an understanding of:
 - Community issues and concerns
 - Perceptions about quality of life
 - Map of community assets
- Community engagement



Community Health Status

- Answers questions:
 - How healthy are our residents?
 - What does the health status of our community look like?
- Provides an understanding of:
 - Community's health status
 - Ensure priorities include specific health status issues



Local Public Health System

- Answers questions:
 - What are the components, activities, competencies, and capacities of our local public health system?
 - How are the Essential Services being provided to our community?

Engages public health system


Forces of Change
